Sir/Madam,

Please refer above subject, it has been noted that some of the state Govts. have issued Govt. order regarding method of admission to Govt./Private Medical Colleges which are contrary to the Medical Council of India Regulations.

In this connection, Kind attention is invited to the Judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 11.9.2002 in the case of MCI Vs. Madhu Singh and Ors. Passed in SLP No. 14919/2000-(2002)/SSC 258 with regard to admission of 1st year MBBS students in MBBS course at various medical colleges/institution, time schedule for completion of admission process for the 1st MBBS course as notified in the Gazette of India Extra ordinary Part III, section 4 dated 1.3.2004, Regulation 5 (5)(i) & (ii) as prescribed in the Graduate Medical Education 1997, under Chapter II, (Procedure for selection to MBBS course) as amended vide Gazette Notification No. MCI - 34(1)/2010-Med./32962, dated 7th Oct., 2010 and 25th March, 2009. The above Statutory Regulations are mandatory and binding in all characters. These Regulations are also available on the MCI website i.e. www.mciindia.org.

The matter has been considered by the Board of Governors at its meeting held on 09.11.2012 and after detailed discussion the Board of Governors decided to advise all the State Govts. to strictly follow the "Graduate Medical Education Regulations" while making admissions of Undergraduate and Postgraduate students as according to Judgments of various Hon'ble High Court and Supreme Courts as delivered time to time, that the MCI Regulations are mandatory to follow.

In view of above, it is mandatory for every State to strictly follow the provisions of "Graduate Medical Education Regulations" while making admissions in MBBS course, so that, the admission holder may get their admission on the basis of merit alone and complete transparency be maintained.
